RAPPAHANNOCK UNITED WAY DEPENDS ON LOCAL VOLUNTEERS

April 24, 2017 – Fredericksburg, VA – For Mountain View High School student Brian Kersellius, volunteering at Rappahannock United Way has given him new insight into his community.

“It’s opened my mind,” said Kersellius who volunteered as a Rappahannock United Way tax greeter this year at Porter Library in Stafford. “I had no idea this program existed. I was very surprised. I realized there are so many people out there struggling financially and it’s great to have a program like this that can at least help them a little bit.”

Rappahannock United Way depends on volunteers like Kersellius. Last year alone, more than 1,400 individuals volunteered over 9,000 hours through Rappahannock United Way. This provided a dollar value of community service worth over \$200,000 to improve people’s lives.

Volunteer experiences included Education-related activities such as reading to school children, income-related activities such as preparing tax returns and providing financial coaching, and health-related activities such as creating meal kits for local families.

“We truly appreciate all of our Rappahannock United Way volunteers,” said Sarah Walsh, Vice President of Community Impact at Rappahannock United Way. “They pour so much time and passion into serving our community and we are honored to work with them. We could not impact our community to the extent that we do without their support.”
