

ALICE[®] Financial Assistance

Eligibility

The primary purpose of providing ALICE financial assistance is to protect ALICE household's financial stability. ALICE households are those that are currently employed, facing a one-time financial hardship, and, due to their earned income being too high, are not eligible for financial assistance from other resources.

If you are currently receiving, or eligible to receive, any of the following you will not be eligible for ALICE financial assistance:

- Subsidized Housing: Public Housing, Section 8, 202 or 811 Housing Vouchers
- Department of Social Service Benefits: TANF, SNAP, FAMIS, Medicaid, Child Care Assistance or Employment Services
- Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Rent / Mortgage Assistance from other government, faith-based or nonprofit organizations

The above list is designed as a general guide to ineligibility for ALICE financial assistance. The purpose of the list is to guide applicants to determine their eligibility prior to completing the application form. This is not an exhaustive list.

Reasonable exceptions may be made at the President's discretion.
